Interesting music choices also, I listen to the Dupre on a regular basis on vinyl. But I am not familiar with Lux Eterna, must sample that. What is really bothering me as of now is it seems you really have to make a choice between vinyl and CD because the early CD's are horrible and most of the later ones are recorded as you say. The early vinyl is the most musical medium there is; (Blue Note; DG, RCA Shaded's etc.) but they are becoming scarce. Once you use a good vinyl rig and play those early tube miked recordings everything else sounds phoney and contrived. So...now what? 78's? It is almost like the controversy over tube rectifiers vs. SS diodes. I really don't care what line anyone wants to sell me concerning that issue, I can hear the difference. So that brings us back to the central question, do we cut ourselves off from a vast musical library due to incompatibility issues with the equipment. Do we build our systems to flatter only one type of music. Do we settle for inferior listening experiences?
