But I've heard some damn fine two-ways, some that were much better than most three-ways. I'd take a DI matched two-way with a smooth midwoofer and tweeter horn over most any typical direct-radiating three-way, even one made with the best components. But all other things being equal, a nice three-way done right is going to win out, sort of like a good big block beats a good small block.
