Hi JohnThe tuner I have is the kenwood kt-7500. I believe, based on reading about it at [FMTunerInfo.com](#) & corresponding with some folk who have had it modded, that some mods do benefit it sonically. Mainly, I think they are the power caps mod (as you mentioned) and in one case, shortening the signal path. Another mod involves changing the opamp, which should make a difference. I think there are some mods that work, and many that don't (since you asked for my opinion...always a dangerous thing to do!). I don't really know about coupling caps....I am planning to put auricaps on my kit tube amp (pusxh-pull 6bm8 k-503 from AES) amp, but will it make a difference? I don't know. I have never yet been able to hear the difference with a power cord. I think most speaker cables sound the same (I use transparent because they seem to lower my noise floor and bring out more detail). I do use little gel bases from Bright Star...they are cheap, and I figure they can't hurt. Have they made a difference? Not really sure, but if any vibrations exist, I am sure they do a good job of absorbing them. I mainly use them with the tube amps to reduce microphonics. I also use cheap tube dampers. Overall, I am now evolving, after about 2 years in this hobby, into just being happy with what I have, and not restlessly trying for more. Just enjoying the music, and once in a way buying vintage stuff, like the Yamaha amp I just bought...what do you think about mods? Which ones do you use?-akhilesh
