Common "guitar books" I own do not mention it (Pittman, Weber, O'Connor, Dave Funk), but there's a chapter "Transistor Dinosaurs" in the "Amps!" book by Ritchie Flieger. Some citations, page 72: "...Because transistors were new and unknown, there was lots of trial and error in early circuit designs....Fender's first shot at solid-state amps was a disaster the likes of which would have killed a lesser company. Fender's new CBS ownership twice released a complete series of SS amps; some shared the same names as their tube brothers....These amps were so poorly made and sounded so bad, they were gone before most players had a chance to say yecch!...Solid state Twin reverb - I really don't know what to say about this amp. I still can't believe someone would do this...(picture)"But, don't worry - if you play some kind of "alternative" rock, this amp is "cool" looking and probably sounds weird enough!
