The most exotic cutting trick I know comes from Terry Cain which is a mitered furniture joint that gives a total of one inch of glue line. Can't recall the name but it's a combination of miters and fingersh that only a furniture shop has the tolerances for. At the local level here, I made a stab at using quarter round and butt joints to get an edge treatment. The quarter round a.) was not milled to the same dimension as the plywood I have and b.) trying to cut oak quarter round in a \$3 miter box is not real reliable. So I'm wondering what can be suggested here for joinery besides butt joints and biscuits. Splines have occurred to me, but ripping the edge of plywood is asking for trouble. I got curious about what could be found at a picture frame shop. But they probably charge for that stuff by the inch.
