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Hi Zeno, I like the sounds best when the centerline between the woofer and the horn is on axis with the ear while seated. I have used the 4pi pro's and they were better for me when on stands or the least, angle back. The theaters are larger and I've only heard them for short durations while on the floor. Maybe this isn't an issue with those or the thermionic's which are very large. I like the JBL 2226 a lot. This doesn't have gut wrenching lows but it does have clarity. This low distortion can bring music to another level aside from just playing it loud. Once I was satisfied with the new sounds I heard I began to search for some lower frequencies, and that meant bigger drivers to keep inline with the rest of the system. Experiment. Sometimes you won't notice improvement until you go backward and notice the loss. Listen for a few days with familiar material. Make a change in speaker position and start listening again. There isn't a lot of science to trial and error. It will familiarize yourself with the different affects speaker placement will have that you can't get from a model or test gear though. enjoy, Bill
