Yes, absolutely. Hated it with a passion, but did not know what caused it. I don't remember hearing it for a while, but now am eager to go back and see if I can still hear it, because that would be good news of sorts. Nowadays mostly what I hear are distorted subwoofers. I tried listening to my older tv's, but my tinnitus drowned out anything that I might have heard. I have an ongoing tinnitus (comes of age), which is "apparently" at a lower frequency - maybe at 11K or so; it changes as my head moves. Should try and see if I could produce beats in my ears, but imagine that I cannot. So, is a flyback transformer singing = music? An interesting sidenote: my Radio Shack sound pressure meter was recognizing a spl of 75 dB or so at some higher frequencies, even though I heard nothing! Maybe I should point it at the back of my tv's.
