Perusing the blogs regarding the Judges rulings in ten cited examples gives a picture of a balanced and thoughtful litigator paving a decidedly fair and careful analysis of these issues. In one case he decided in favor of a defendant who had exhausted his default options in the State of Pennsylvania. Based on new evidence Alito superceded the State Statute in favor of another look at the circumstances in consideration of the death sentence imposed on the defendant. In another case he offered an opinion contrary to the prosecution regarding whether instructions to the jury were improperly issued at trial. My point after reading through an analysis of ten rulings of the 3rd circuit court issued by Alito shows that he sided four times with the state; three times against the state; and three times in favor of further review. That looks good to me; the fact that in capital cases he recognizes the seriousness of the issue to find for the defendant if so warranted.
