What exactly is vague about the cinematography in Blade Runner? Or did we blend into talking about Dark City? Ok. as to Dark City, it's strongly influenced in cinematic style by the German Expressionistic films of the 20's like The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari and the world of Fritz Lang (Metropolis) and F.W. Murnau ("M"). Dark City is so dense even 4 or 5 hours of explication leaves q's. Dark City is a noir murder mystery set in a science fiction nightmare.
