I don't know. The Belden is quite a bit stiffer, with fewer conductors. Otherwise I have no idea why it sounds better, but it does by a large margin. I have found in general that Belden cable sounds as good as many higher priced "audiophile" cables, the only difference being the lack of snake oil in the Belden.
