Since no one here knows your speaker building skills, personal music tastes & listening preferences (bass, midrange, imaging, dynamics), system/component preferences, room size & acoustics, prior experience and reference points for speakers, etc, etc.... How can you expect others to tell you why you would choose one design over another? Quote: And if I did do a line array, could I build a line array that would blow this away if I spent the same? Or, if I could spend less, what could I spend that would blow it away, and what would that cost? You could spend ten times more and make something that absolutely sucks. How can anyone else know what you are capable of skill-wise?
