When Public Enemy released their first album, they established something called The Thank You's at the end of the record. The thank yous would be a litany of celebrities artists and historical figures in the black heritage such as Martin Luther King, Nkomo Shange, Toni Morrison, Paul Robeson, WEB Dubois etc. We were pleased that the first list included The Last Poets. The Last Poets was a collective that produced a few records in the 70's and were contemporaneous with Gil Scott Heron. Not long ago I was surprised to learn that the Last Poets "When The Revolution Comes" and "This Is Madness" were available on cd. I requested that my local library make this part of acquisitions which they did. Now new artists can hear the source material for much of what rap has become. I would start with the Last Poets.
