Hi, Yes you can make most XM receivers send a signal to an FM tuner in your car. But the XM service is still a you pay for one. I use it all the time, but use the mini phone jack to connect to my car's audio (it has an aux input). XM is rather nice on long trips as it doesn't fade out except when you have something block the signal - like going through a tunnel and sometimes right next to a big building.
