My use of Auricaps is based on its reputation from other builders, and truth be told, I have no idea how they stack up against cheaper components. As far as "boutique" parts are concerned, Auricaps are actually on the "cheap" end of the scale. My feelings on coupling caps is the same as those for interconnects. Their use cannot make a system sound better, only worse. It's just that the better ones degrade the signal less, or in a less objectionable way than the poor quality ones. Gar.
