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Well, it's a tower. So it's nice for places where floor space is at premium. It also puts the

midwoofer and tweeter at ear level, even without a stand. But that also means the woofer is high enough that floor bounce affects midbass response. That's always the case with a two-way system though - If the midwoofer is two or three feet up, either by being stand-mounted or by being in a tall cabinet, then there is a reflector two or three feet away. Reflectors always cause a little and you lose a little. Midrange is at ear level, but bass is too so floor bounce comes into play.

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
