Sorry, I simply assumed it was a Martinelli design since it appeared on his homepage. Adrian Mack's "High Efficiency Speakers" display had a remarkably similar layout, but with the horn included within the cabinet, and the midrange device is the 300Hz conical mentioned earlier.
