The part goblins ate all my .47 caps so I'm using a .33 with just an 8 ohm resistor to juice the horn while it breaks in. Out of balance with the woofer of course, but you can tell its gonna stay clear and extended even after the attenuation gets adjusted and the titanium breaks in.

I've had good luck with the PSD2002, but the DE250 is a good tweeter too, and its price point is smack dab in the middle between the Eminence PSD2002 and the JBL 2426. The TAD 2001 is another good compression driver to look at, having a beryllium diaphragm and top-octave extension to match. But it's pricey. If you ever get a chance, check out the TAD 2001.
