The premise is that the shows are set in "real time" -- each season consists of 24 one-hour segments that cover a single 24 hour period in which a country-threatening terrorist threat (nuclear, plague, etc.) surfaces and is ultimately resolved thanks to the efforts of our hero and his associates. Two illustrations as to how addictive the show is: 1. I started watching the show only this season, its fourth. After about two episodes I went out and bought Seasons 1-3.
