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The DIY bass trap shown in the photo is simple a bag of Pink Batt fiberglass insulation (still in plastic bag) wrapped in fabric (according to Jon Risch Recepte). I have built another two bass trap (at first reflection point) using polyester insulation and wire mesh etc. Too much work and too little gain so a bag of insulation is probably the best value.
