No, I think it has too much HF ripple and distortion. Also, I don't think I'd use a folded horn for midrange. Better to use a simple straight conical horn in my opinion.

If I do a straight horn with a cutoff of 100Hz, How long do you think it would have to be? I don't want the cabinet to be wider than 24 inches and no taller than 36 inches. I don't know if I could get away with a shorter horn if I make its mouth a 20"x20" square.

A midhorn used from 100Hz up should be about 3 feet long and needs a fairly large mouth. You can try different configurations in Hornresp to see what you can come up. Here's one I did for the
