The goal would be to keep the original drivers and build a larger cabinet, possibly ported, and modify the crossover to fit. The goal would be to transform the speaker from a rocker to more of a even handed smoother all rounder. Is there any info from someone who has pondered this ? I know that the original cabinet is undersized for the woofer which shifts the tuning up and works well enough. Now what if I decrease the tuning ? Will the speaker still integrate well or will there be too much group delay with a port ?
