Eminence has always made good bang-for-the-buck parts, but these new parts aren't anything I can get excited about.

I find more often than not the sound gets muddied and I would rather live with out the strong 20-35hz. I'm going to try some of the BMS 12" and 15" this summer and see how they sound. They've modified them in a way that makes them unworkable for me. I don't intend to design something for the new drivers they're building now, so that means I won't be offering a premium line using Eminence any longer. They're still great for the bang-for-the-buck lines, but I was hoping to see them maintain their high end stuff too.
