I got a pair of the S-1's for use as HT surrounds about 5 or so years ago when my interest in speaker building was getting going for real. I have used the cabs for experiments in sound but my question is: Do you have drawing and construction details that aren't proprietary for the boxes themselves? 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The material is probably 45 lb industrial particle board, veneered on both sides. MDF was not even available commercially back then, or at least it wasn't stocked. A total net thickness of 13/16" would confirm this. Probably just a mtre'd and braced cabinet. I did Speakerlab work but that was the mid 70's. Ya taking me back.TC
