The problem is you can't match the directivity of the Alpha 10 with the H290 horn unless you use the midhorn. I mean, you can use the crossover rolloff to "squeeze" the pattern, but you can't get a good acoustic directivity match unless you use the horn.

That's a tough question for me, because I used those piezo tweeters for over 25 years, and had a sentimental attachment to them for the little boxes. They were inexpensive and sounded good. I think they were much better than the generics or the "orange masher" variant. Made for a good, inexpensive, high efficiency speaker.

But all that said, the dome tweeter we now use is much, much smoother. If that part had been available in 1980 at that same price point, I would have used it. But back then, all the dome tweeters were at least 5dB too low in sensitivity. I just couldn't make a high-efficiency speaker back then with domes or ribbons, and I did search for both.
