in my experience, these Chinese amps usually sound really good. AND are a great bargain. If I were Audio Research or Conrad-Johnson I'd be worried.one thing, though--I've had quite a few of these things brought to me after the importer or mfr. disappeared. Usually the power transformer died, or there was heat damage due to something burning up on the PC board.so, if you want your tube amp to last, take some free advice--KEEP IT COOL. Point a fan at it and live with the noise. The amp will last longer.

Sounds like good advice. I always turn on the ceiling fan when a tube amp is running. Buying the cheapest "anything" out there is a gamble, and that's especially true of tube equipment because of the higher operating parameters than solid state. I doubt this was designed with much excess capacity built into the power trannie, resistors, etc.
