That one is a difficult one to acquire. I talked to a designer of mike pre's and he expressed concern over using a valve whose supply of acceptable examples is small and getting smaller. I was warned to watch them for noise. I would caution buying them w/o a noise guarantee.Radio Electric Supply has them for \$65 each and a guarantee would could be confirmed ahead of time. I have gotten excellent service from them, and for a rare and difficult tube, I'd go nowhere else.cheers,Douglas

Thank you for advice. BTW - he has many tubed gear in his high-tech recording pro studio. Mikes need EF806S and AC701 (!), and various other devices (preamps, compressors, guitar amps...) need "common" tubes like ECC81,82,83,88, EF86, etc. But, he found that only TFK & Mullard (with few exceptions) are "good enough", very expensive these days. "You electricians think you`re so cool. Then you die."
