Internet service is FAR too expensive as well. When cable internet first came to this area, it was about \$30 per month. Now, it's double that for the lowest speed service they offer. But, I do like my internet, so I suck it up and pay for it.....

Cell phones are another prime example of highway robbery. My first cell phone cost \$25 per

month, but the cost kept increasing over time, until it cost us \$105 a month for two phones. And, that only got us 1000 minutes and 250 texts total, if I remember right.

So, we bought a couple of month-to-month, no-contract prepaid phones elsewhere. They cost about \$80 each to buy outright, and the service (1000 nationwide minutes and 1000 texts each) costs \$30 each per month.
