Those 4Pi mains will be powered by either my 5wpc EL84 tube amp or on occasion my 60wpc vintage SS Harman Kardon.

For 2 channel I am running a Transcendent Sound Ground Grid for a preamp.

If I am reading the specs of the GG correctly, it says that it has a max output of 20volts, so that should be enough to drive a Crown XLS1000?  
At only \$250-\$300, the XLS1000 sure seems like a bargain when you look at the power and versatility it offers.

Looking at your 3Pi sub data, it seems the XLS1000 should have enough jam to run a couple of 3Pi subs (215W @ 8 ohms stereo / 350W @ 4 ohms)?

For movies I use an older Denon AVR, I am not sure what the output voltage of this unit is. I will have to try and find the manual to see what it outputs.
