Other description: It has two belts and moving the larger one to a different groove on the spool changes the speed to 45 or 33. Sure cartridge. The weight on the end of the arm looks like brass. The serial number on the bottom begins with XA, which I now realize must be the model. Is that the entire model number? Joanna
