Hi, It looks like some type 811 tubes driven by perhaps EL34s. A stereo single ended class A amp in any case. Based on those guessesin assembled form likely to be in the \$2000 range. Depending on the actual quality perhaps quite a bit more. Not my personal style though. I much prefer push-pull output stages and less costly components. I figure a p-p pair of reasonable pentodes will outperform a single ended triode design for a lot less money and IMO sound better to boot. YMMV
