There are; as I see it some good choices you could make if your budget is tight. You could try an older table like a Thorens with the crappy Thorens arm for now.I like all of the 1600/1700/1800 Technics tables because they have the good arm and are built like tanks, very speed stable and troublefree. And they sound pretty good. You can get them off E-Bay for 150\$ usually with a decent cartridge. They retain their re-sale value also.If you wish to go new; the Rega is a good table but after paying full price you may hit the 450\$ mark. And truthfully; the least expensive Rega probably doesn't sound any better than the Technics does. Maybe worse with worse wow and flutter specs.

MGW; I'm not sure what you mean by quiet? The mechanism of the tables is noisy or the records are noisy? The main problem with the old Dual and Garrards is the arm; if you can butcher one of the tables you can probably put a better arm on it; you know, take out the auto-return mecahnism and fabricate a tonearm board. My other suggestion would be to purchase an older AR XA and then do the simple very cheap mods that make this table pretty good for next to nothing. Then the price of the table should not exceed 90\$ for a reasonable condition example; twenty bucks for the mods and it should sound darn good. Hell; I still listen to mine downstairs and that big fat spacious sound is still lots of fun. Especially on the older Rock/pop/classical records from the 60's and 70's. Where there is a will there's a way.

Old dual idler drive tables need maintanance after they are 10-15 years old. A new idler wheel and proper platter and motor lube would probably do it. A repair manual can be purchased for around \$10 that will tell what oils to use and show how to fix almost anything on them. The 1229 is a decent table when fixed up, as are the 1219 and 1019.Dave
