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On the microscopic levels that the groove exists in even a slight rattle of the stylus body can smear some HF signals. So by taking a toothpick with a couple drops of crazy glue and gently securing the stylus body to the cartridge body you tighten up the whole cartridge as a unit. It seems to me to make the sound a little more detailed and smoother.

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
