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You can measure the loudness with a decibel meter. They're fairly inexpensive to acquire on Amazon. However, a quick trick is to hold the earbuds at arm's length with their music playing as usual. If you can still easily hear the music, then you know it's too loud for them.

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Usually, there would be a warning that would pop on your screen when the volume is too loud.

You can use that, in general, as the minimum level, then decrease the sound from that if you think it's still too much.

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That's a good question! You can use a free decibel meter app on your phone, just put one earbud close to the phone's mic and play the music at its usual volume. It won't be exact, but it gives a rough idea. Safe listening is usually under 85 dB, so if it's louder than that, it's best to turn it down. Some phones also have built-in volume limit settings you can use for kids.

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Measuring the noise can be done in many ways, but the ones that I would suggest you do are these two methods.

The first one is what I call the talk test. You need to talk when you are standing a few metres away from them. If they are unable to hear you easily, then you need to reduce the volume.

The second one is what some have suggested already which is using a phone app like the NIOSH sound level meter. You measure this by placing the phone mic right against the earbud cup to measure. The aim should be around 75 dB which is ideal for kids. Once you get the measurement right, you won't have anything to worry about anymore.
