The oldest commercial software that became popular was Dragon Dictate, now known as Dragon NaturallySpeaking. It's pretty good, and there are others too. It doesn't sound to me like you want to fiddle much, so you probably want one of the proprietary "shrink wrapped" packages that you can buy.
