Hi Wayne and All,

Received the basic Mimir dac. No Forkbeard module, no preamplifier, just the dac. Cost was \$299 plus tax and shipping. Looks great, simple to use.

Separate external power transformer supplied for linear power supply, just plug in, or use the USB for power. Transformer use increases the output voltage spec. I auditioned with both power sources.

Toggle power switch on back. No thumps on power on. Simple front push button switch to activate individual inputs.

Basically no specs given, except usb supports up to 32 bits/384 khz. Also came with 1 meter usb, A and C ends.

My computer is using VLC Media Player. I used the Mimir supplied usb as I had none with C end as I had no other USB with C connector.

I used Tidal and YouTube. I have ~50 hours of play time. Sound seems to be stabilized.

I don't take much stock in other's reviews because I know little about the quality of the audio systems others use. Schiit also makes some claims.

I have auditioned the Denafrips Pontus, basically all the Chords including the Dave (12 grand), and probably another one or two from other audiophiles and now I do not miss any of them.

The Mimir is simply incredible. The harmonic structure from deepest bass through the highs is incredibly natural. Great dynamics, dimensions, tonal balance, everything sounds amazing. With all polypropylene decoupling capacitors in my audio system, years of listening testing, we can perceive 1 part in 4,000,000. Using 20 log equation, that is -132db down, so extremely transparent.

There is a sonic difference between YT and Tidal. I do not know how Tidal sonically compares to Roon, Qobuz, Deezer etc.

In conclusion, the piano and other instruments sound so gorgeous from deepest note to highest register. I still almost cannot believe it.

I guess one can conclude I highly recommend it.

I just added, via pigtailed, Vampire gold plated copper jacks to my Schiit Mimir analog outputs, using Jenalabs wire. What a sonic improvement of the Vampire vs the original brass jacks. Sounds so much more natural.

Yes, it is. It is difficult to describe Wayne, but just when I think the sound is as real as it can possibly be, the sound becomes more real with the updates. (50% of the electronics is in the recording venue.) Improving half of the total electronics makes a definite improvement, as we all know when comparing components.

I have discovered fairly early in 4+ decades of research that the recording and playback electronics are a major factor limiting sound quality, just as speakers, room etc are.

I have been running the updates day and night for about 100 hours. Will continue and see if any more changes occur.

Hi All,

Nothing is labeled, except chips, and the traces are hidden from view, so I installed a couple of better quality audio grade Nichicon capacitors in the power supply for the single ended op amp.

Other caps are mainly digital and main supply before regulators etc.

No poly caps and cost of such would be a grand or more, plus external chassis.

The caps I used are no longer manufactured or sold, and were never manufactured in large enough ufd/voltage values.

The caps I tested and use now for other projects are Mundorf aluminum in oil. Larger values sound great, smaller values, like other brands tested, will sound more or less accurate, and may need a tweak I can do to the copper/gold plated jacks.

Important: Never believe websites that claim to test and rate capacitors. They have No idea of how to correctly run a test and I have yet to find results that are even close to accurate.

The analog appears to be dc coupled, Burr Brown Audio chip which has very good gain bandwidth product.

I am thinking of offering an upgrade to the Mimir single ended outputs, pigtail analog output jacks and upgrade caps. I only use all copper/gold plated jacks. I need to tweak the jacks no matter the brand.

If this is not allowable, I will delete this offering and offer my apology.

I also like and use the Nichicon capacitors although I now use polypropylene capacitors in decoupling applications. 20 ufd is getting a little physically large for me as well.

Back in the day, I used a couple of brands, the silver looking Infini caps by TRT were the most accurate/natural, but the accuracy depended upon the ufd, and nothing over 10 ufd was manufactured if memory serves me correctly.

Around 2 decades ago, the Infini became extinct (except by special order the last time I checked), and I started using Mundorf in oil (after testing), although I found some smaller value ufd's not that ultra accurate, just like other brands vary.

Wayne, I wonder how many truly understand the efforts we go to, to design excellent components? Truly a labor of love.
