Since around 2014, I've used the Aviator Club Combo, the SuperBlock Ultra and the Quilter Aviator Mach 2 Head. \$650 was a lot for me to spend on an amp around 2014, but I closed my eyes and did it when I got that Aviator Club combo and the performance was so good that I was not perturbed when I got the Quilter Mach 2 Head for around \$1400 in 2022.

This is because I knew what I was going for and was not worried a bit about the quality.

The Quilter brands last longer and bring that peace of mind which means that you don't have to get a new tube every year and that was a big factor that I considered when I switched to the brand.
