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Thanks a lot Bill, for your hospitality and the opportunity to listen to the array speakers. They were crossed over actively at 100 hz into a pair of (dissimilar) passive subs. These were the first line arrays I have ever heard. I was impressed by their frequency response, which I thought sounded pretty flat. The clarity was very good, and overall response was smooth. The one caveat: I think you need a minimum distance for imaging to kick in: these were listened to in nearfield, and hence imaging was an issue. In my opinion, listening to them off axis slightly increased imaging somewhat. Another way to improve imaging was to reduce the volume. Overall, I was extremely impressed. thanxakhilesh
