There is a variation on this called the Bob 3 here...main difference I can see is that some absorbent materialis used on the baffle. If that rubberized stuff is notavailable, PE has some product for damping sound in carpanels like door skins etc. I think Fitz mentioned this as a way to a line array as well.
