The Goldwood 8" FR PE part number 290-379 is again out of stock but would perhaps model well for the Voigt pipe. Since this driver is selling out on a regular basis I'm thinking that the driver is being used for current projects since it became available about half a year ago. Followup remarks did say that making a Voigt Pipe includes a fair bit of luck. Terry Cain has also made this design.
