Has 4 Control Knobs: (Off/On/Volume) (Tone) (AM/FM/AFC/Phono) (Tuning) On the back there is a Phono input jack as well as FM antenna terminals. The dimensions of the radio are: 14 inches wide by 5.5 inches deep by 8 inches tall. This is all the information that I have found or identified; any help in identifying the model number of this radio is greatly appreciated.
