I bought some 47 $\mu$ F 35v parts (or thereabouts) maybe 6 months ago, and they were just a couple bucks each. About the same for polarized and non-polarized parts. So while they were more expensive than other electrolytics, they weren't as expensive as polypropylene caps. But when you get up into the high voltage values, I guess that's where they get expensive.
