Shortof finding a loose solder joint or being able to make it happenby tapping on things with a wooden/plastic stick, you're likelyto need a 'scope to see where the transients are coming from.Tube use high voltage, so be very careful. Only one hand nearthe chassis at a time. The other one goes in your pocket.Chris
