I've change all the tubes except for the rectifier tube and the 6j7 and it hasn't improve the sound. can this be due to the capacitors? the fact that the caps are old, and therefore dry, may be the cause of the cracky sound while playing?do you know at how many ohms does that speaker work? could it be the speaker?thank you very much

Capacitors have improved a lot in the years since your amp was built. So swap them out. You might also clean (or replace) the tube sockets.
