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Glad it was useful to somebody and not widely in use already.BTW here is the best tip I ever got outside of being a cabdriver: If you have a screw that has the top worn off and you can't get it out with a screwdriver do not try todrill it out first. A method that was passed on to mewas to file one of the screw sides flat and then the opposite side. This makes it a snap to get the screwloose and removed with a small pliers or other pinchtool. I encountered the initial problem with a 5.25 driveand couldn't sensibly drill in toward the mechanism. It's the best tip I know and I wouldn't have thoughtof it yet if somebody at alt.fifty-plus.friends didn'ttell me about it. Save and share with my compliments.
