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Glad it was useful to somebody and not widely in use already. BTW here is the best tip I ever got outside of being a cabdriver: If you have a screw that has the top worn off and you can't get it out with a screwdriver do not try to drill it out first. A method that was passed on to me was to file one of the screw sides flat and then the opposite side. This makes it a snap to get the screw loose and removed with a small pliers or other pinch tool. I encountered the initial problem with a 5.25 drive and couldn't sensibly drill in toward the mechanism. It's the best tip I know and I wouldn't have thought of it yet if somebody at [alt.fifty-plus.friends](#) didn't tell me about it. Save and share with my compliments.

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
