Whether selection happens at the rear or at the front, the signal still has to travel from back to front to the volume knob. I can see that it cleans up wiring a bit, in that only one set of wires has to travel back to front, instead of 2, 3, or 4 sets.Gar.

If this changes the amount of noise pick up, I am not sure.I'd consider the neatness and simpler is probably the better way to go. Short wire to teh switch, single to the volume control.
