Sorry, I don't remember anything about it other than it offers the choice of a "50" or a "300B" output tube and sounded really good with the "50" tube in place. But did you notice that little "Sound Creative" amp Russ brought to the meeting. It's a 10 watt/ch SET using Sovtek KT88 output tubes, and it sells for \$299 on Ebay! How can they sell a tube amp for \$299? From what Russ said the seller bought a pallet of them and has about 20 left. Of course there's a greater risk of a no-name \$299 tube amp dying prematurely, but if that happens you've only lost \$299, less

than most of my Houston Audio Society friends spend on a pair of interconnects. I ordered one just for fun and probably will bring it to the LSAF.Go to Consumer Electronics, then Amplifiers, and do a search for "KT88" to find it.

I suspect they meant to name it the "Creative Sound" amp, but as is often the case in Chinese to English translations, the translator got confused. My favorite example of this is a tube preamp I once bought on Audiogon from a Hong Kong seller for a grand total of \$320 including air freight. It's an "Audio Experience" MKII. I noticed a piece of black electrical tape on the back panel, which was covering the words "Audio Experiment":) Turns out it's not a bad preamp at all. It's point-to-point wired, which made it very easy to upgrade all the resistors and caps in the signal path and put bypass caps and a choke in the power supply.
