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If you're on a budget, go with the Stage four Pi. It uses an Omega 15 woofer instead of the more expensive Kilomax. Don't use a 2" exit compression driver. They're more expensive and don't go up as high.

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Have you looked at the Kappa 15LFA? What kind of cabinet volume can you tolerate? This driver will work well in 3 cubic feet, tuned somewhere around 40 Hz. Might be a good compromise to the Kilomax, while still a smaller box than the Delta requires.Just a thought...Colin
