Two problems:1) The 1/4 20 are too thick to go thru the slots w/o forcing them,and the heads are small(see #2) 2) #10-32 are the right size bolts but the heads so small they go right thru the soft material of the horn when you tighten them down.We need to find #10-32 with the oversize pan head JBL uses. Even black washers are unsightly.

The key is hex key is also smaller so you can not apply as much torque, and over tighten. This would have a nice large head like the Pan Heads you like. It just uses a allen key.
