Typically you'll pump alot more power into them to feel your getting the same subjective level, since you are missing room reinforcement. It is dramatic, sometimes. Generally a system that can hold its own outside is a pretty capable system. Nearly all mid size and up venues outside (over, say 4-500 people) use some pretty hefty subwoofers and feed em alot of power. You wouldn't be able to stand it indoors.
